Exploratory Play

What do the children gain from this type of play?

Emotional Satisfaction- helping to build confidence in themselves, their abilities, their surroundings and their own self-belief. This in turn can help the children to heal any small doubts they have about themselves and their abilities, teaching self-regulation of emotions.

Access to information-learning through their own exploration the malleable properties of resources and there uses. From each other they learn to discuss and problem solve gaining the ability to do for later life. Asking adults questions through play in a relaxed fun environment forges the belief that to ask questions is a good thing and doing so is positive and rewarding.

What does it look like?

Exploratory play is physically exploring the environment, digging the earth making rivers climbing or exploring into the shrubbery that little bit further each time. Learning when to stop is also very important and is done within our play environment. Children must also learn how to cope with slips; trips and falls; which when experienced through play are not as shocking to the child. We always encourage the children to look at the situation and how to assess and deal with those experiences, this is all a learning process with adults on hand at all times to guide support and listen.

What Skills do the children develop?

Thinking, reasoning, problem-solving, assessing risk, readiness to encounter new experiences creativity, private speech and self-regulation.
